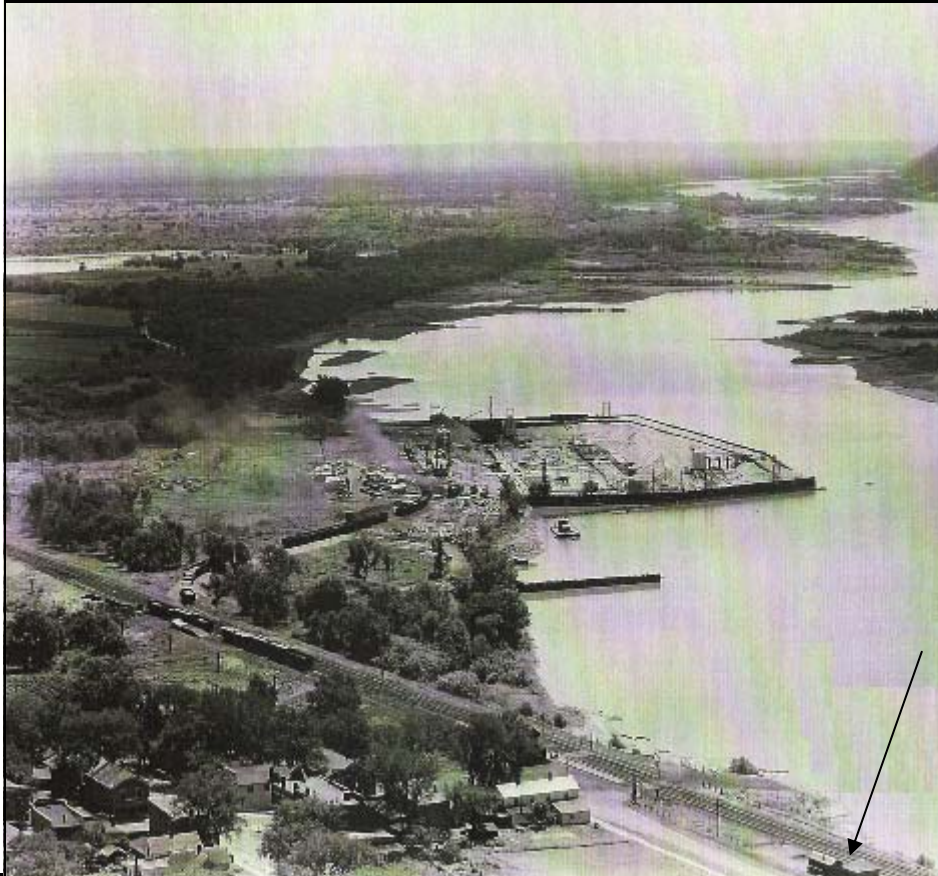

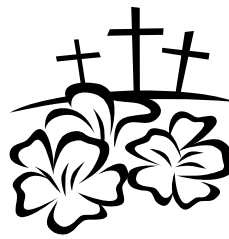

Did you know....When I was going through the 1957 Operating Policies of the G-E School District, I was surprised to read "School shall open with a teachers meeting on Labor Day."



When I was at the WACO convention in Stevens Point, I happened to sit next to this gentleman.. And it seems the conversation always comes down to "And where are you from?" When the answer came back "Chautauqua, NY" I found it very interesting...as it was home of the 'Chautauqua'. The first Chautauqua's started, I believe, in the 1870's, but when I got home I had to drag out my old 1812 hymnal for Camp Meetings. It states that it uses the well recognized hymns (I didn't know any of them). But more interestingly, it tells how to conduct a camp, or tenting, meeting. Main points included in this.

- 50 to 100 tents for lodging
- Fires were to be kept burning during the night inside the circle of tents and wagons, while the public services last.
- if the weather allowed, it should continue not less than three days and nights

And to me the most interesting statement of all - "It is not desirous to have more than two or three thousand present"

I keep wondering in 1812 how far people would come, to have a gathering that large, and how far "West" were they going, as it said in the book that the camp meetings started in Tennessee or Kentucky?

Do You Remember Easter Postcards?

Have you mailed out your Easter cards yet? No, well time is running short, you better not lay an egg. Get hoppin!
 Did you know that the tradition of sending Easter postcards to relatives and friends developed during the end of the 19th century? In the beginning both black and white and colored cards were printed. Most of the time, the center of the card contained an oversized egg. During the first years, these postcards were sent, the front side was empty. This space was where the sender wrote their greetings, because post offices would only allow the address and the stamp on the back side. In 1905, Austria and Germany separated the back side of the card into two halves. The right half served as the space for the address and the stamp and the other half was the new space for the message. In 1906, this was officially allowed by the world-post-congress in Rome.

Around 1910, the cards were colored with children and usually in some context with lambs, poultry, and eggs. Young girls were a symbol of luck and hope. The Easter bunny often portrayed with eggs was a symbol of fruitfulness. During the First World War, children were replaced with soldiers and a military appearance of the Easter bunny was common. After the war, Easter postcards featured Jesus in the open countryside surrounded by sheep. Cards with flowers were also very common.

The number of Easter postcards declined through World War II. Since then, the number of cards sent has also declined, especially during the past decade because of competition with the telephone and email.

Surprise someone this Easter by sending an Easter card or postcard. How delightful to go to the mailbox and get something besides a bill or advertising. What an easy way to make someone happy!

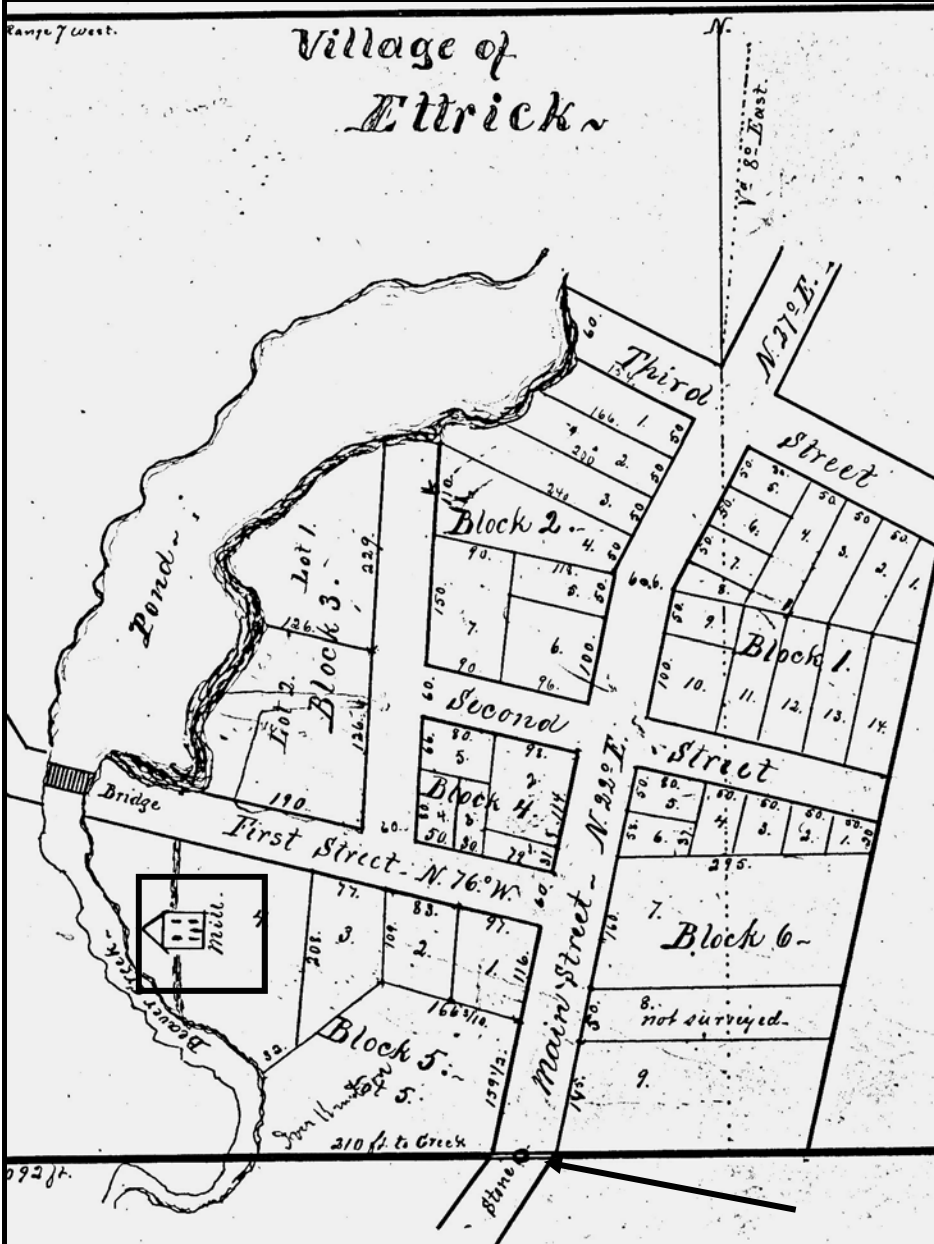

Above is an 1878 map of Ettrick from Bill Crogan. Note the mill in the square... This is the original grist mill in town. Notice that it is on the village side of Beaver Creek. When I got this in an email, I had to call Bill. He said that it looked to him like the water power to the mill came under the street. In looking at this map, it places the mill at about where Krackow's Blacksmith Shop is now. Before the Blacksmith shop, long before, the mill was possibly used as the first school house. The Beaver Valley Roller Mill which sat on the other side of Beaver Creek, was the newer structure that we are familiar with. Does anyone know, was there a culvert or some type of "channel" that ran under the street? Are there any signs of that still around? Note, the arrow points to a spot marked "stone". The surveyor's notes with the map state: "Main Street is the base of the survey in which stones are placed or marked on plat from which future surveys may be made."

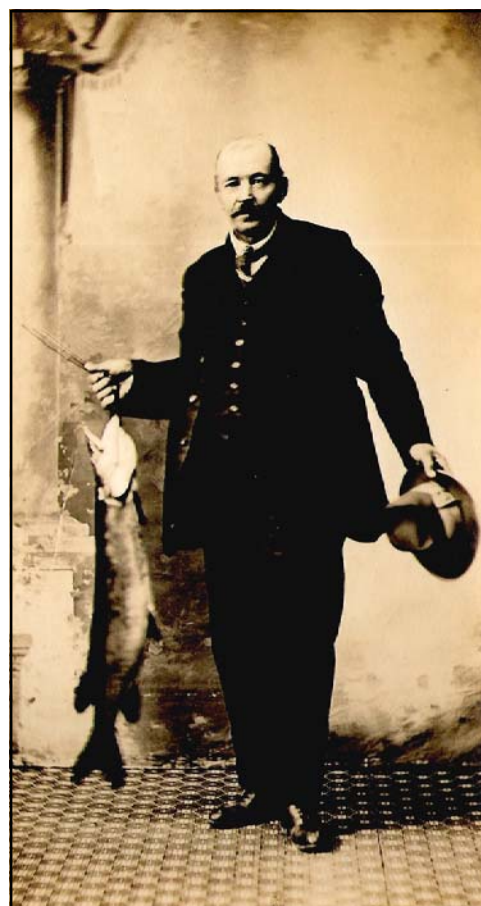
