



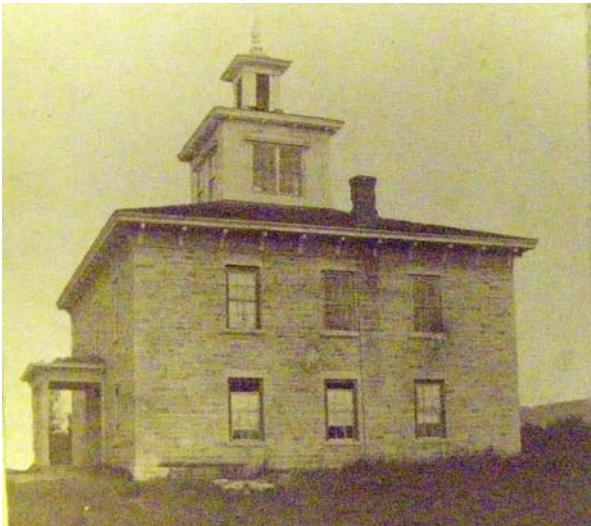

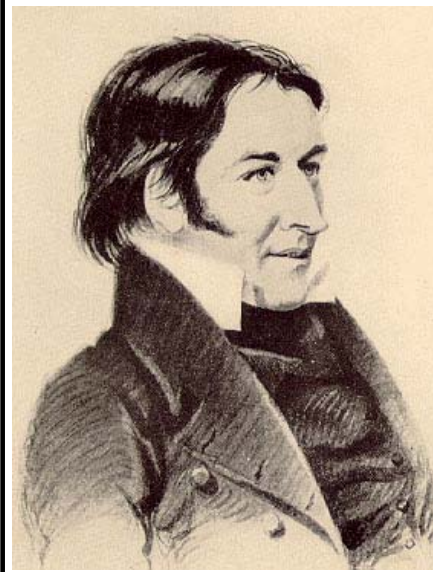

I knew immediately what the contents in the big white envelope were about when I read the return address "B. Bublitz". She had called just a few days earlier regarding the Utter House and the fact that it was destroyed in a fire in 1883 and the question "did they rebuild?" I could hardly wait to tear it open and was thrilled to not only find photos but the following letter:
 "I knew my family's part in its history. It is still there on Third Street, much changed, and perhaps not known as the Utter House any more. Present owner, Jim Beebe, of West Salem, told me a few years ago he thought it was built in the 1880's. I had thought earlier, but did not know of a fire in 1883. So Jim was right.
 Charles Utter, early settler (1854) and business man, built the place as a hotel/rooming or boarding house. His daughter, Retta, the last of his family to live there, owned the home when my grandfather, L.A. (Bert) Wakefield, his daughter, Marjorie, and a son, Robert, took rooms there about 1912-1913. Marjorie (my mother) and Bob lived there until they left school - My mother father, Curtis Homer (the son of the J.T. Homer and Son Hardware store in Galesville) were married in the house in 1926.
 My grandfather continued to live in the house and Retta Utter (he always called her "Miss Utter") really became our surrogate grandmother. We called her Auntie Ray. Through the 1930's and early '40's, my sisters, Elizabeth and Harriet, and I and our parents had many Sunday and Christmas dinners there. Our grandfather built a porch swing in front, and Auntie Ray always had plant stands and hanging baskets of flowers between the pillars.
 Entrance to the house was through the front parlor with formal furniture covered in scratchy uncomfortable fabrics and big floral oil paintings a sister of Retta had done many years before.. Auntie Ray's bedroom was off to the left of the parlor, with the bathroom beyond it. Past the bath was a pantry which led into a small kitchen. Off the kitchen was a screened and shuttered porch which served as a summer kitchen.
 From the parlor, on the right, there was a large bed/sitting room with a private outside entry as well. It was off limits to us girls as were the second floor rented rooms.
 Straight ahead out of the parlor, through heavy velvet-like curtains, was a large dining/sitting room with a fireplace and a floor to ceiling cupboard, with a dumb waiter beside it, to the basement, where the original kitchen must have been. The basement, as we knew it, was the furnace room and Grandpa Wakefield's work shop. We girls weren't supposed to go in there either! Next to the dumb waiter and cupboard was a door to the side entrance hall and a stairs to the second floor.
 We girls liked to look out the bay window by the dining table, to watch boats on the river and trains through Trempealeau and on the Minnesota side.
 Grandpa Bert's bedroom was to the right off the dining room. I liked to go through his stacks of "Popular Mechanics" and similar magazines kept in his room, which also over-looked the river.
 Retta Utter died in 1946. My grandfather, Bert Wakefield, died in 1948, aged 80, at the home of my parents, Curtis and Marjorie Wakefield Homer, in Galesville.
 I think it was shortly after Miss Utter died that the 3rd floor attic was removed from the house. I have not been in the Utter home since her death and know nothing of its story since then.
 Perhaps this may be of some interest to you - I have enjoyed remember those long ago days!..... Love The Chat! s/ Barbara Homer Bublitz

Little Known Postal Facts

Did You Know?

When the million-dollar Hope Diamond was donated to the Smithsonian Institution, it was mailed from New York City to Washington, D.C., in a brown paper parcel?

Rural carriers once picked up and delivered groceries for customers along their routes?

In 1827, one section of the New York City Post Office was reserved "exclusively for ladies?"

3,149 carriers were attacked by dogs in in Fiscal year 2007?

Initially carriers hand-delivered mail to city customers. To alert customers that they had mail, carriers would knock or ring at doors, or whistle?

By 1912, new customers were required to provide mail slots or receptacles, and existing customers were encouraged to do the same. But in 1914 it was estimated that no more than half of city delivery addresses had mail slots or receptacles and that some carriers still spent up to one hour each day waiting at doors?

The first digit in the ZIP Code indicates a general geographic area of the nation, starting with "0" in the eastern U.S. to "9" to represent areas in the western U.S. The next two numbers in the ZIP Code represent regional areas, and the final two numbers identify specific Post Office™ locations or postal zones?

The money order system was developed primarily to provide a safe means for Union soldiers and their families to exchange money through the mails during the Civil War?

In 1963, the five-cent First-Class™ stamp only covered 80 percent of its own costs. Taxpayer subsidies covered the rest?

Today's U.S. Postal Service earns its own way without taxpayer support for postal operations and delivers 202 billion pieces of mail to 291 million Americans at more than 141 million addresses?

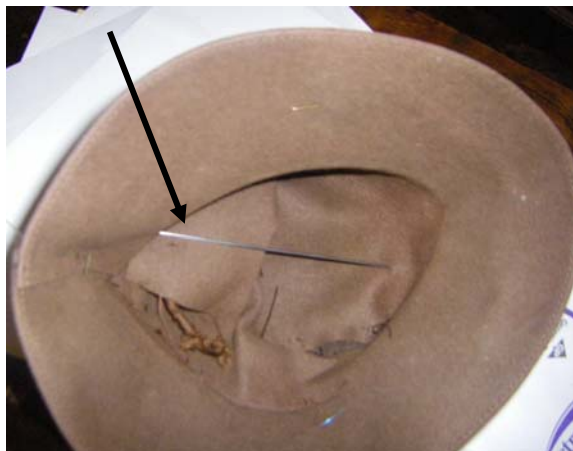
