Barney answered the following ad: "To the Unemployed...A number of steady men can find employment by vending this paper. A liberal discount is allowed to those who buy to sell again." He was hired by the publisher of The New York Sun to sell papers. Barney was 10 years old.

The newspaper carrier has changed over the years; often times it is now an adult driving a car, rather than a young person delivering on foot or by bike. They are a part of our life, so much so that a number of songs have been written through the years about the 'Newspaper' boys.

The Route Has Changed ...

Over 150 antique cars (all older than 1942 with the oldest being a 1909 Overland) from around the nation will be driving through our area on Monday, September 8th.

Half of them will be following the route below in the morning and the other half returning to LaCrosse via the same route from Arcadia in the afternoon.

From La Crosse, they will cross the Black River at North Bend, come through Skunk Coulee, onto Crystal Valley Rd, then turn left onto Gilmeister Rd., go over the hill into Silver Creek, take Silver Creek RD to HWY 53 into Galesville, follow Ridge AVE to "T". Take "T" to Oak Ridge Rd. , coming out by Roy's Store, then to the Brush Museum. From their they will go on F and then Kamrowski Rd, then CTY G to Meyer Valley Rd., then CTY J to Memorial park in Arcadia. They will then be going to Elmer's museum and work their way back through Wiona.
