Trapping Fact Sheet 2008 - 09 Trapping Season



Background: Management of furbearers on the Refuge has been ongoing since the fall of 1981. Furbearer trapping is a useful tool in maintaining balance between furbearer populations and safeguarding Refuge infrastructure such as dikes, roads, and water control structures.

Refuge Trapping Auction: An open bidding system is used to assign trappers to the various units. Only participants with a current State of Wisconsin trapping license are permitted to bid. Licenses will be checked prior to the start of the auction. Qualified applicants voicing the highest bid on a unit then receives exclusive rights to trap that unit for the duration of the trapping season. The Refuge is divided into 15 muskrat units and 4 beaver units. In addition, there is one senior citizen unit and two youth units included in the trapping boundary. These units are awarded by a random drawing after the auction and are free of charge. Senior citizens and youth trappers must be present to participate in the drawing for those units. Funds generated from the trapping auction are returned to the Refuge for maintenance costs to roads, trails, parking lots, boat landings, signs and other facilities.

Furbearers: Trapping is permitted for a variety of species; however, muskrat, beaver, and raccoon are the primary target species. Most trapping activity occurs in and near Refuge wetlands. All upland areas inside the Wildlife Drive are closed to trapping. Any non-target species trapped must be reported and turned over to the Refuge Manager.

Permits: Only trappers with Refuge issued permits are allowed to trap on the Refuge. Permits are issued a week after the auction and can be picked up at the Refuge office. Trappers must have their issued permits on their person at all times when trapping on the Refuge. In addition, windshield cards are also issued and must be displayed when parked along Refuge roads when involved in any trapping activity – including scouting. All the conditions of your trapping privileges are clearly defined on your permit. You are responsible for knowing the Refuge trapping regulations.

Mandatory Report Sheets: report of catch, number of traps and number of trapping nights must be reported every Monday before close of business. This is a requirement of the trapping permit. Thus, failure to do so may result in revocation of your trapping privileges and permit. All Wisconsin State trapping regulations apply.

***No trapping west of River Bottoms until October 31, 2008**

Trempealeau NWR to Hold Auction for 2008-09 Trapping Units

Trempealeau National Wildlife Refuge will offer trapping units for muskrat and beaver during the Wisconsin 2008-09 trapping season.

Bidding for the units will take place Wednesday evening, October 1, 2008 at 7:00 p.m. at the Refuge Maintenance Complex.

There are twelve muskrat units and four beaver units available for bid. Trappers must show a current Wisconsin state trapping license when registering to bid. Bids will start at \$40.00 per unit. Trappers must be present at the auction to bid. Payment for units is due at the close of the auction.

Muskrat units are also available for bid for both Youth (18 years of age and younger) and Senior Citizen (65 years of age and older), free of charge. If you would like to enter in the drawing for these units, you must be present for bidding and provide a current Wisconsin trapping license and proof of age.

Interested trappers may inspect the trapping units prior to the bidding on October 1. Please stop at the refuge office to pick up a map and unit history. Additional information on the trapping program may be found on the web at www.fws.gov/midwest/trempealeau, or by calling the refuge headquarters at 608/539-2311, ext. 16, (TTY users may reach Trempealeau National Wildlife Refuge through the Wisconsin State Relay Service at 1-800-947-3529). It's amazing how I run across things when I'm looking for something else. I was looking for more facts on the Butler report to Roosevelt, when an article on the beginning of purebred pigs in our area caught my eye. I'm sure area farmers already knew this, but it was certainly 'news' to me. And as I read this, many thoughts ran through my mind.. Like, did this have an effect on the feed mills around here... What happened to these young farmers and their pure-bred stock as time went on...Did this carry on into neighboring Ag programs... How many farmers are raising purebred swine and sheep now. Anyway, J.O. Beadle was talking about his first fair here as an Ag Instructor, he was surprised to find only a single pig exhibited. It was at that point he decided locally we needed the introduction of pure-bred swine. By the early 1940's he had changed things and there were over 20 boys in our area raising purebred hogs of various breeds and their registered stock was being sold widely. At that time, Perman Severson, John Sahlstrom and Carroll Sacia were raising Duroc Jerseys. Poland Chinas were being raised by Miles Carhart and Henry Crogan; Chester Whites. by Merlin Wilber and Earl Ravnum. Hampshires by Leslie Waller and Donovan Hilton and Berkshires by Leslie Gartner, Jr. On purebred sheep in that period, there were six boys in that work, and they had 25 spring lambs to care for. Kenneth Kopp, Leslie Grover, Howard Blankenhorn, James Smith, and Alvin Ekern were local F. F. A. "pioneers" in raising purebred sheep, their choices being Shropshires; Hampshires and South-downs. By the way, I never did find the Butler information I was looking for.

"It's one of those"... A "Whatzit. I think it is some type of incubator but not sure, if you know anybody that raises pheasants, maybe they would know."... That's all Bill Crogan was able to tell me when he sent in these photos. It is owned by Lyle Krackow, in fact, that's Lyle sitting in his shop.
